# A CARING COMMUNITY- -

On May 7 northern Cass County was hit by two EF-1 tornadoes. By far the most severe damage occurred at Wayne Township's Twin Lakes and areas to the north east. But, within minutes of the end of the storm, people were emerging from their basements with chain saws and other tools in hand to check on their neighbors and to offer assistance in removing downed trees and other debris. In just over twelve hours the Wayne Township Fire Department answered 17 calls, thankfully accepting assistance from fire departments in Decatur, Niles, and Dowagiac. Three homes burned, but the department prevailed, answering emergency calls on foot when trees blocked the roads, and even "borrowing" a pontoon boat to respond to one emergency.

Help descended on the area immediately from MEC who brought in additional utility company repairpersons to help; the Cass County Road Commission, assisted by the Van Buren County Road Commission; and MDOT. The Township Supervisor, Cass County Emergency Manager, and County Commissioner were in constant evidence during the next few days. Township inspectors for building, zoning, and electrical services continually roved the area to lend their expertise. The American Red Cross brought in food for emergency workers and residents, and FEMA surveyed the damage to determine what federal benefits might be available. Thirteen agencies responded with various kinds of assistance. The Township can rejoice in the knowledge that, while destruction was severe, no lives were lost and no serious injuries were reported.

When tragedy strikes, it can bring out the worst in people, or it can bring out the best in people. We are truly fortunate to live in a community where the best prevails. Wayne Township is proud of its residents.
